


Are you up for the Challenge?

Regardless of your major, if you are a matriculated CUNY undergraduate student and have a predilection for quantitative thinking and mathematics, the CUNY Math Challenge is for you!

\$2,500 Grand Prize

Sponsored by the Office of Academic Affairs and the CUNY Institute for Software Design and Development (CISDD) and supported by the Office of the Chancellor, the CUNY Math Challenge seeks to identify and reward CUNY's best math talent. Students are invited to compete for over a dozen cash prizes, ranging from \$500 up to a grand prize of \$2,500, funded by the Academic Leadership Award received by Chancellor Goldstein from the Carnegie Corporation of New York.

How it Works

The first step is to register now to prepare for the first of four online rounds, containing five problems each. A new round opens every other week beginning Monday, February 15, 2010. Participants have two weeks to submit their answers in each round, accumulating points along the way. Questions in each round are of varying levels of difficulty, and no prerequisite courses are required for participation.

Students with the highest total points after the first four rounds will be invited to the final round, an in-person exam to be administered on Sunday, April 25, 2010. Approximately 30 qualifying students will compete in the final round for the cash prizes mentioned above. Winners will be publicly recognized at an event with Chancellor Matthew Goldstein.
